School, in order to form a more perfect Apollo program, establish Creativity, insure 600 wing Tranquility, provide for the common Autonomy, promote the general welfare, and secure the Blessings of Individuality and innovation to ourselves and our Posterity, do ordain and pronounce this Constitution for the Central York Apollo program.

Bill Of Rights

*Amendment 1 - Freedom of Religion, Press, Expression
Apollo shall make no judgement towards a specified religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; all students will withhold the freedom of speech, of the press; the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Program for a resolution of grievances.*

Amendment 2 - Right to bear Creativity

A well rounded class, being necessary for the high school, the right to bear creativity and inventiveness, shall not be denied or infringed.

Amendment 3 - Quartering of Projects

The Apollo program will grade you on the quality of work you present in a number of four projects and four mini projects. These projects will be allocated equally for the time allotted.

Amendment 4 - Research and Incubation

To ensure guidance and direction is imposed, all who are in the Apollo program will be required to attend incubation and begin the process with adequate amount of research, guaranteeing they will have information and sources to provide.

Amendment 5 - Trial and Presentation

No student shall be denied the opportunity to present on their time of convenience; enforcing that all must present to each teacher for each project produced.

Amendment 6 - Right to Speedy Presentations

In all project presentations, the presenter shall enjoy the right to a speedy presentation; by an impartial group of the 3 teachers; and present only when ready.

Amendment 7 - Exercise Individual Vision

All students have the right to exercise their own innovativeness and originality in order to create projects that conform to their individual artistry. This is what sets Apollo apart from other classes and why Apollo excels in Central York High School.

Amendment 8 - Cruel and Unusual Grading

Excessive supervision shall not be required, nor excessive agonization, nor cruel and unusual grading for the students inflicted.

Amendment 9 - Construction of Constitution

The enumeration or detail in the Constitution, of certain rights, shall not be interpreted to deny or belittle others retained by the students.

Amendment 10 - Powers of the Teachers and Students

The powers not entrusted to the Teachers by the Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the students, are reserved to the students respectively.
