

Questions to ask religious people:

1. What religion do you follow?
2. What made you become a religious person? How old were you?
3. Why have you continued to follow Christianity / Islam / Judaism
4. Does your faith make you a happier or better person, and if so how?
5. Do you take the bible/ quran/ torah literally or more figuratively and why?
6. Does your religious belief provide comfort for you when thinking of death?
7. What do you think the world would be like without religion?
8. Can you explain the general beliefs of this religion?

Questions to ask atheist:

1. How long have you been an atheist? What made you become one?
2. Why do you not believe in god?
3. Do you think people should challenge religious ideas and beliefs, or should these beliefs be held to a higher degree of respect?
4. Do you think religion does more good or bad? Why?
5. What is your opinion of agnosticism?
6. Does not believing affect your view of death, as bad thing or something to worry about?

Questions to ask agnostic people:

1. Explain your view on the existence of God.
2. When did you form this view and why?
3. Do you think it should be okay to challenge people's religious views, like any other topic, or do you think it should be held to some higher degree of respect like it is?
4. Do you think religion does more good or bad and why?
5. What is your opinion on atheism?
6. Does not knowing or choosing to not have an opinion on the existence of God affect how you view death, as a good thing or sad thing?
